Meet the New Steering Committee



Each month, we're celebrating a key voice from our new International WIM Alliance steering committee. This month, we're proud to introduce **Engr. Janet Adeyemi** a powerhouse in engineering, governance, and advocacy for women in mining.

A recipient of the *100 Global Inspirational Women in Mining award* (2017), Engr. Adeyemi is the Nigeria Country Chair on Sustainability and a Fellow of the **Nigeria Society of Engineers, the Nigeria Mining and Geosciences Society**, and the **Institute of Management.**

She holds:

- a Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of British Columbia
- an M.Sc. in Engineering from Loughborough University, UK
- a B.Sc. in Geology from Obafemi Awolowo University
- a Law degree from the Open University, Nigeria
- multiple certificates in mining, governance, human rights, and sustainability from Ivy League institutions

Her professional journey includes serving in Nigeria's Federal House of Representatives and working in the executive arm of government.

In 2006, she founded **Women in Mining in Nigeria (WIMIN)**, an organisation empowering women in the extractive sector. She now leads the **Technical Committee of African Women in Mining** and is an active member of the **International Women in Mining network**.

Engr. Adeyemi is a respected voice in international discussions on natural resource governance, climate change, sustainability, and gender equity. She currently serves as:

- CSPF Representative for the World Bank and IMF in West and Central Africa
- Board Member of the Association of Women in Mining in Africa
- Member of the Global Advisory Committee on Adolescents and ASM Project, among several others
